


Federal States of Germany ("Länder")

16 Federal States responsible for disaster management in peacetime Federal Government responsible for civil protection in wartime (support in peacetime)





Responsibilities of the Federal Government

- Support of local communities and the federal states, when <u>asked</u> for assistance
- Use of own operational forces of the federal Government
 - Federal Agency for Technical Relief (THW)
- Collection and analysis of information and resource management
 - Joint Reporting and Incident Centre (GMLZ)





Responsibilities of a Federal State

- Ministry of Home Affairs and Local Government of North Rhine Westphalia
- 'Board of Control'
- highest level (administrative) coordination
- coordination of assistance on federal state level
- supporting local authorities







THW foundation

- Founded in 1950 as a federal agency, subordinated to the Federal Ministry of the Interior
- 1951: First Local Branches established
- 1953: First Federal Academy installed
- 1953: First Mission abroad (Flood in the Netherlands)
- 1958: Saarland joins as the last 11th Regional Office





THW's mandate

- Civil defense and protection
- THW law
 - Local and <u>national</u> disaster relief (on request of local authorities <u>only</u>, e.g. Fire Departments)
 - International operations on behalf of the Federal Government and by order of the Fed. Ministry of the Interior






- Basic element of all THW units

The "modular system": supra-local units


- Deployed in all 66 regional offices

THW Training System

<u>Basic Training:</u> 120 hrs on weekends and evenings for all volunteers

Specialised training: on evenings and weekends, as well as up to one-week centralized courses



International Training: Centralised one-week courses, Basic Course for Foreign Missions, Logistics, Engineering, etc.

EU & UN Courses: up to 2 weeks





- Long term projects in third countries
 - → MoFA
 - \rightarrow United Nations (e.g. UNHCR)
 - Ministry of Economic and Development Cooperation
 - \rightarrow DG ECHO humanitarian aid



International Strategy THW

- Civil contribution of Germany in the following fields:
 - Technical and logistical organisation on federal level
 - Focus on emergency response, link to recovery and development aid
 - Support of embassies, NGOs, etc.



- Civil contribution to DPKO, ESDP missions
- Active participation in international relief systems (EU, UN) and networks
- Development and deployment of resources for international missions
- Permanent qualification of personnel

SEEBA = M/H-USAR

- Rapid Deployment Unit USAR
- Established in 1988
- Deployable within 6 hrs
- According to INSARAG Guidelines
- Classified as "HEAVY Team" by UN-OCHA





SEEWA = Water Purification

- Rapid Deployment Unit Water Supply
- Established in 2002
- Deployable within 12 hrs
- Water purification plant for 6,000 l/h
- Water analysis with mobile laboratories
- Well cleaning
 - Repair of water supply systems







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SEELift

- Rapid Deployment Unit Airport Support
- Based near Frankfurt/Main Airport
- Ready to go by 24/7
- Operational within 2 h
- Skilled logistic experts
- Customs clearance

Logistics Centre for missions abroad

- Hub for THW logistics abroad
- next to Frankfurt/Main and Hahn airport
- Storage area: 1,600 m²
- Log-handling of THW missions abroad:
 - Storage, shipping/dispatching, checking and maintainance of THW international unit's equipment
 - Equipment is always packed for (air) transport and available on short-notice



Tunesia: Cooperation THW-ONPC

<u>Main approach:</u>

- Reinforcing bilateral relations between Germany and Tunisia in the field of civil protection:
 - Enhance the response capabilities of ONPC by the establishment of additional units
 - which are entirely staffed by volunteers.
- Goals:
 - Strengthening the operational capacity of ONPC
 - Creating social engagement from citizens to citizens
 - Volunteer action to link «old to new Tunisia»
 - Contribute to a democratization of ONPC
 - Daily democratic work in associations
 - Pilot for other countries





TUN: Aim of the project

- Establishment of additional rescue intervention units (specialised technical platoons later on) in Tunisia
- Made up only of volunteers which are:
 - trained and
 - equipped
- All volunteers are organised in well-functioning, democratic local associations.
- The units and associations are fully integrated in the civil protection system of Tunisia.
- Population and authorities know and request the units.





Jordan: Joint Capacity Building

- Jordanian-German Joint Capacity Building-project to support the operational capacity of the *General Directorate of Jordan Civil Defence* (JCD).
- On the level of the headquarters in Amman as well as on the local level in governorates.
- With emergency response equipment and by training civil defense staff.







(Northern-) Iraq: Capacity building

Since mid 2016 the THW focus in Northern-Iraq is on capacity building.

- Support of the Joint Crisis Coordination Centre (JCC) and Joint Coordination and Monitoring Centre (JCMC) with:
 - Trainings
 - Procurement of operational equipment
 - Study Visits to Germany
 - "On the job"-Trainings
 - Mentorship
 - Regional co-operation
- Current activities:
 - Procurement of relief items
 - Logistics training of local staff
 - Development of training curricula for 2017-2020








Columbia: UN-Mission
